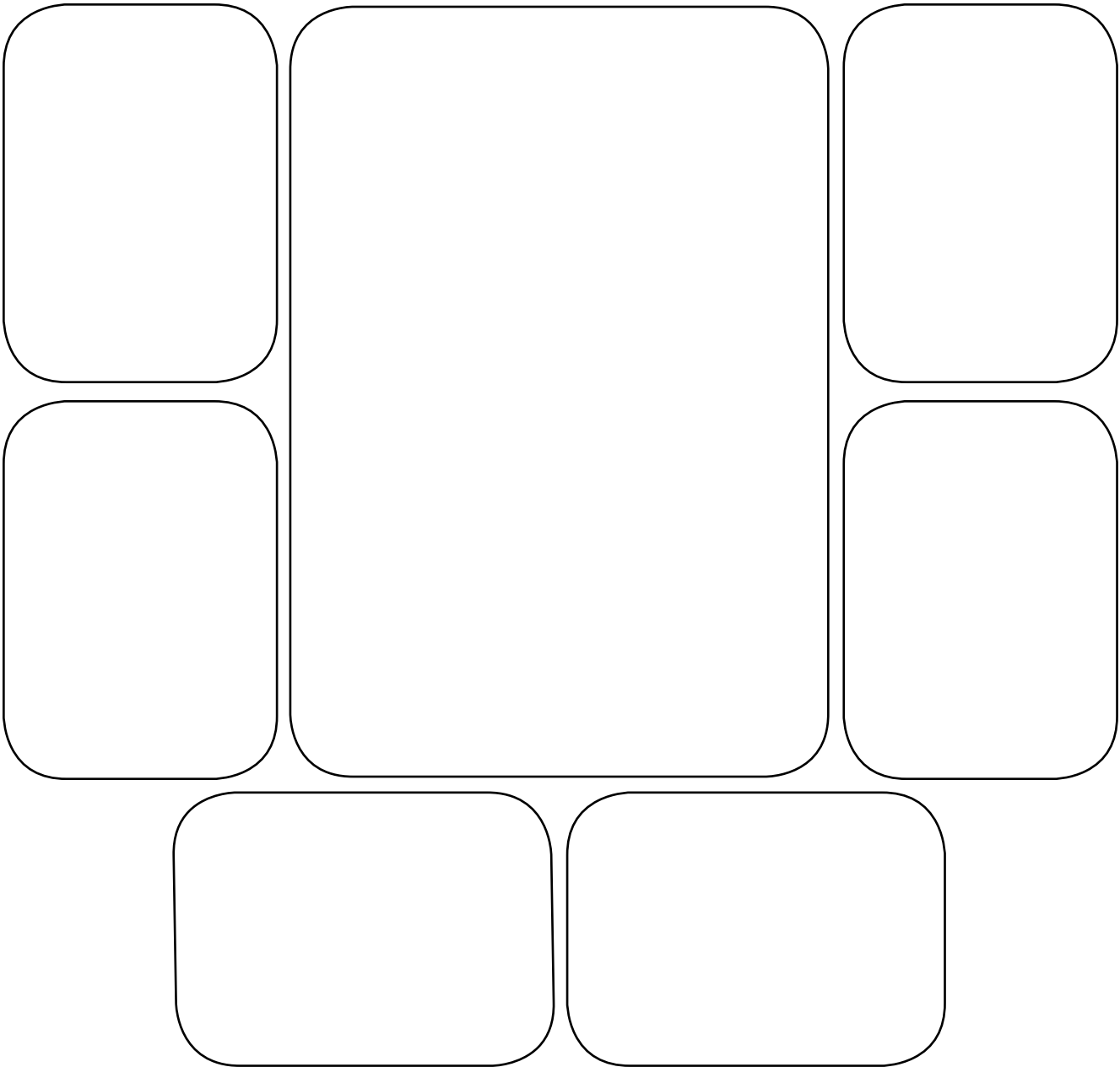


A Cluster web is useful to:

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Begin with an idea in the central circle. • Branch different ideas from the center. • Add and extend each oval with new ideas.

A Diagram outline is useful to:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Describe a body system, an object, or thing. • Visualize an idea. • Have a detailed diagram and its description.
How to complete a Diagram outline :
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make a diagram of a body system, an object, or thing in the center square. • Write in the other squares sentences that describe the body system, object, or thing. • Draw lines to relate the diagram to the descriptions.

1 Aorta:
The blood leaves the heart through this blood vessel. The longest blood vessel in the body.

2 Renal artery and vein:
Blood is carried to and from the kidneys.

3 Iliac artery:
It divides from the aorta. Supplies blood to the pelvis and lower limbs.

4 Femoral artery:
Supplies the thigh and lower leg with blood.

5 Pulmonary vessels:
Take oxygen-poor blood from the lungs.

6 Heart:
Most important organ in the system. Pumps the body's blood.

A 5 W's chart is useful to:
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Organize main ideas about a story.• Examine the key details of an event.• Organize ideas to speak or write a paragraph.• Check the comprehension of the story.
How to complete a 5 W's chart :
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Select an story, song, or anecdote you have to write or speak of.• Answer the questions in the chart according to what happen in the event or anecdote.

How	The sisters were sent to the border because of the Revolution. There was a shooting and an American soldier tried to saved them. But during the shooting one sister got lost.	
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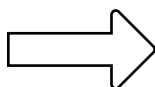
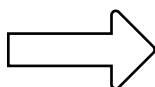
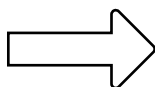
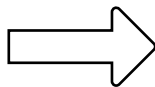

A Cause-effect chart is useful to:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Describe how events affect one another in a process. Organize ideas to speak or write a paragraph.
How to complete a Cause-effect chart :
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Select a topic, or a set of events. Write what happens in the event or an aspect of the topic, that is the cause. Next, write what happens as a result of the event or aspect, that is, the effect. Use this information to prepare your notes to speak or write a paragraph.
