

## EXPRESSIONS FOR DIRECTIONS

To give directions we use a verb of motion in imperative form + direction adverb + a place

Imperative	Direction	Place
Go	straight	until you see a roundabout.
Turn	right	on Flower Avenue.
Walk	past	Rose Street.
Turn	left	on Park Avenue.
Walk	around	the roundabout.
Go	across	the park.

You don't usually use the pronoun *you* with an imperative; only if you want to differentiate between two subjects: **You** stay here while **I** ask for directions.



Walk straight



Walk past



Turn left



Turn right



Walk around



Go across
