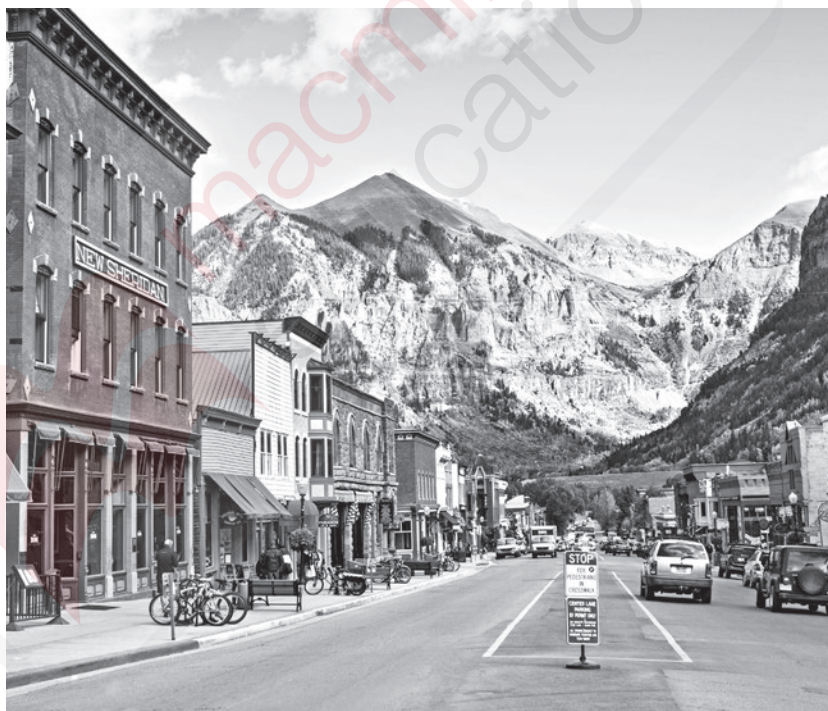

### Transportation Services

The main bus service is called the RTD. The buses have stops all over the city and you can take it to Denver, the capital of Colorado, which is only an hour away, and even to the airport. There are taxis, of course, but the most popular means of transportation is the bicycle! Almost everybody has a bicycle and rides it from school or even work. Bicycling is considered so important that if it snows during the night, the city will sometimes clean off the snow from the bicycle paths before they clean the roads. Many people take their bikes into the mountains. There are special trails for bikers and hikers. You can get maps of the 200 miles of trails in the mountains around Boulder.

You can ask the farmers about growing crops and many other tips.
